Dear Sir or Madam:

This firm represents Mr. Laolu Saraki. I write regarding certain content currently available at the 419 Coalition's website (<http://home.rmci.net/alphae/419coal/news2010.htm>) that contains false and defamatory statements regarding Mr. Saraki. For reasons that follow, we request you remove this content.

Your website reproduces in full an article entitled "Nigeria at brink of another civil war, nation dragged down by 419 scams – Intelligence report," originally published on February 18, 2010, by the online publication Ghana Business News (www.ghanabusinessnews.com). In this article, Mr. Saraki is wrongfully accused of several serious and damaging activities and affiliations.

On December 7, 2010, we contacted this article's author, Mr. Emmanuel K. Dogbevi. We informed Mr. Dogbevi of our grave concerns regarding the article's truthfulness and his potential liability for defamation. As Mr. Dogbevi is also the Managing Online Editor of www.ghanabusinessnews.com, we requested he remove the article from the Ghana Business News website and take appropriate remedial action.

On December 9th, Mr. Dogbevi removed the article from www.ghanabusinessnews.com. He replaced it with a rejoinder submitted on Mr. Saraki's behalf, allowing Mr. Saraki to address the accusations. (The rejoinder is available at www.ghanabusinessnews.com/2010/12/09/rejoinder-nigeria-at-brink-of-another-civil-war-nation-dragged-down-by-419-scams---intelligence-report/.)

We request that you remove this article from the 419 Coalition's website. Indeed, even the article's author has renounced it and no longer publishes it. Accordingly, we hope you will not find our request controversial, and that Mr. Saraki will not need to take steps necessary to vindicate his name and protect his rights.
